DEACON'S REPORT

I have been assured by the Bishop that I will continue as the Deacon for All Saints' Jensen Beach for the foreseeable future. My functions will be unchanged as well. I will continue to be the Deacon for all services in our church just as I have for the past five years. I am so glad, as I love our church and feel closely connected to all of you as my extended family. I will continue to be available to any of you in need of pastoral care. Just call our church office and leave me a message.

I continue to visit any church member or family member as I become aware of the need, especially if you are unable to attend church due to illness or disability. I want to bring Communion to you or help to arrange for another lay eucharistic minister to do it. We also want to offer healing prayers for you or help if you need other services to maintain yourself at home.

I also administer the TRUE (Toward the Relief of Unexpected Emergencies) Fund for any church or community member in need of financial help to pay rent, utilities or even food. You can also contact me at the office about this.

I continue to visit prisoners at our state correctional institution, MCI (Martin Correctional) for a weekly bible and prayer group. I am a Kairos Ministry Program volunteer as well, which is a Christian ministry based on Cursillo that visits monthly to minister to prisoners as well as providing spiritual weekends and retreats for those prisoners who want a closer relationship with Jesus. We will have a retreat during the second weekend of June (16,17).

As I mentioned in my last report, I have started to be involved in a new justice ministry with other clergy in Florida called Faith in Florida, hoping to utilize work to providing more help to Florida residents by improving a wide range of social services such as homeless shelters, better housing and medical services.

I will be attending a conference with other clergy in Orlando on June 18 and 19 where we hope to inform those running for office in Florida about the needs of many indigent and incarcerated residents of our state.

All Saints' Episcopal Church Designated a Martin County Historic Site

May 13th marked the official dedication ceremony for the plaque designating that All Saints' Episcopal Church is on the Martin County (Fla.) Historic Register. Martin County Historic Preservation Board Commissioner Doug Smith, Board Member Joette Lorion Rice, and Julie Preast, Martin County's 2018 Preservationist of the Year, attended the ceremony. The plaque is affixed to the outside of All Saints' Church beneath the original plaque commemorating the church's opening in 1898 and consecration in 1899.

The designation of All Saints' Episcopal Church in Jensen Beach, Fla., as a Martin County Historic Site resulted from the diligent work of Church Historian Joyce Fletcher Menard, Junior Warden Paul Neff and Julie Preast, who submitted a 179-page Historic Designation Petition to the Martin County Historic Preservation Board. The Petition noted that All Saints', which was constructed by Bell & Baker, "is a prime example of the frame, rural Carpenter Gothic style found mostly in the Southern United States during the 19th Century, inspired by the work of Richard Upjohn."

All Saints' not only is the oldest Episcopal church in Martin County, but it also is the oldest community church in the county that has served as a place of worship throughout its entire existence. We are proud of our beautiful, historic church!

All Saints' New Church Sign

We have our new sign!!! Well, we have Phase 1 of our new sign at least! A big thank you goes out to Flamingo Signs who worked through “monsoon” weather to install our beautiful new sign before Father Frisby left. On May 20th the 10:00 congregation processed down the hill with the clergy to the cemetery to bless the sign. As prayers were said and incense was offered, the children blew bubbles (provided by Father) to “accompany our prayers up to heaven.” The children were also given cans of spray chalk so they could write their names in the grass. We were all so happy that Father Frisby was able to bless our sign.

As of this writing, the electricity has not been connected yet. The weather has made it difficult for projects to be completed on time, but Electrical Connection has promised they will complete their work before the end of June 2018.

Phase 2 will begin next month when I go to zoning for a Variance Permit. Our sign is currently at the maximum allowed height of 6 feet and adding the decorative cross trim to the sign will put it 1 foot 4 inches over the height limit. So, a permit is required with many required steps: 1. Get a new survey. 2. Mail a return receipt requested survey letter to all businesses and residents living 1200 feet/yards (not sure which) from the sign to get everyone’s permission to add the trim. 3. Present our petition to the zoning board and pay \$690. Lots to do!

I want to thank everyone again for your many contributions which made the sign possible. You all are a blessing to All Saints’ Church! And now EVERYONE who drives by knows who we are!

All Saints' Children's Christian Education




