DEACON'S REPORT

I have now been *leading a Bible Study Group at Martin Correctional Institution now for over 6 and a half years. When I was working on becoming a Deacon, I had to choose a special ministry to devote myself to, in addition to what I do at All Saints' where I was already the Coordinator for Pastoral Care and Administrator of the TRUE Fund.*

I felt God's call to work in the prisons with those who were incarcerated. I did explore devoting my ministry to working more with the elderly and spent time with Donna Hall accompanying her to various facilities for those in nursing homes and assisted living facilities and probably would have been good in this ministry as well. I have done so much of and continue to do pastoral care, but God just seemed to be calling me to visit those in prison.

I had heard George Kinard, Chaplain at Martin Correctional Institution (MCI), talk about the need of ministering in the prisons in Florida because there were so many incarcerated in our state that were in such need of outreach. I contacted him and visited him at MCI after receiving security clearance.

After being there, I just felt the need for reaching out to these men there who were so often totally neglected by our society. We have about 1500 men at MCI and there are about 30 similar facilities in our State. Chaplain Kinard suggested I do a Bible Study Group which I have now been doing on Thursday afternoons since January, 2012. It is not a large group, but every week between 5-10 inmates come to see me, many of whom are very consistent in their attendance. I also minister to others on an individual basis who really lack anyone to whom they can talk about their needs.

At times I have thought about discontinuing this group, but the meetings seem to have such meaning for several men who have been in prison for over 30 years and have no one else to whom they can really relate.

The group has evolved into one where we open with the Kairos Community Prayer, then read the Psalm for the day in our daily Episcopal readings which meets their spiritual needs. Then I give each of them Communion using our LEM format. (I have been told that the Catholic Deacon does not give Communion to non-Catholics, so I share with all who say they are baptized. Then, we read one other book of the Bible in some depth and close with my favorite prayer, the one attributed to St. Francis of Assisi.

It's over a 20 mile drive, but I feel committed to these men who so much appreciate seeing a Christian Deacon.







All Saints' New Church Sign

Have you driven by the church at night time to see our brilliantly lit sign? If you haven't had a chance yet, drive by for a look. It is magnificent and tells everyone who drives by that All Saints' is right at the top of the hill!

Thank you again to EVERYONE who contributed towards this wonderful endeavor. Louise Andrews, our Master Gardener, has already begun planning the landscaping for the sign which will be completed once the weather cools off a bit. We'll accept all offers of help when the planting begins!

Phase 2 will begin soon when I go to zoning for a Variance Permit. Our sign is currently at the maximum allowed height of 6 feet and adding the decorative cross trim to the sign will put it 1 foot 4 inches over the height limit. So, a permit is required with many required steps: 1. Get a new survey. 2. Mail a return receipt requested survey letter to all businesses and residents living 1200 feet/yards (not sure which) from the sign to get everyone's permission to add the trim. 3. Present our petition to the zoning board and pay \$690.

In this photo c. 1977-78, there was a plaque of memorials, to the left of the stairs which went to the choir loft when it was 1st installed. The plaque was discovered in the rector's office closet during the summer of 2018. The wall on the right-hand side of the stairs is the load bearing wall that was removed in 1994. Removing that wall lead to fall 2017's closing of the choir loft.

At the top of the plaque it reads:

There are 21 items listed. Twelve of them are still in use.

1. **The Sanctuary Bell** – Given by The Rev. & Mrs. Arthur A. Smith In Memory of their Daughter Rachel Maria Paula” [Used primarily at 8 a.m. and on Wednesdays.]
2. **The Sterling Silver Cruets** – Given by Mary S. Ruelius In Memory of her husband John Ruelius 1892-1968 [Used at Christmas and Easter]
3. **Brass Offering Plates** – Given by Mrs. Raymond Swartling In Thanksgiving for a Happy Marriage.
4. **The Holy Water Stoop** – Given by Arlene D. Lockwood in memory of her mother 1889 Cornelia S. Duncan 1976
5. **The Sanctuary Lamp** - Given by Edward Gordon and Allan F Brewer in memory of their parents Frank and Marguerete and George Riddle Wein.
6. **The Scholarship Fund** Given in Memory of Henry Sumner LeDuc 1894-1954
7. **The Enamel Processional Cross** Given by Mr. & Mrs. Harold Allard in memory of their parents Stephen E Allard and Albert E. Saunders [Still in use for funerals and Easter]

- 8. The Audio – Visual Memorial** established by Walter Hewitt in loving memory of Francis Clark Hewitt [Still partially in use; part has been over the advancement of technology]
- 9. The Christus Rex Crucifix** given by Prentice L Kinne in memory of his mother Florence A. Newcomb 1885-1962 [Hangs above the altar today]
- 10. The Memorial Garden** to the Glory of God and in Thanksgiving for the Life of Bror Carlburg 1898-1965. [Upgraded and maintained by Louise Andrews, Master Gardner]
- 11. The Advent Wreath** by Mr. & Mrs. Arthur A. Hansen in memory of their parents. [Used at Advent]
- 12. The Six New Pews** given by Joseph & Nancy Johnson in loving memory of Matthew Douglas Tungate 1979. [Used in the back of the church still.]

Both of these items are stored and no longer in use.

The Gold Brocade Vestments given by Carolyn & John Fulton in joyful thanksgiving. [Stored in Coffey Hall]

The Portable Communion Set Given by Earle Everts in loving memory of Ida P Everts [Stored in the Sacristy]

These three items are no longer in use and their location is unknown. So if you see one of them, please say something.

“The Gold Chalice - To the Glory of God In Thanksgiving for the ministry of Frank Rafael Alvarez, Rector, 1970 – 1977”

The Lectern Bible by Albert & Thomas Walker in Memory of Lillie A Walker 1920 – 1974

The Tabernacle by Myrtle May Foster in memory of her brother Walter Warner Van Sciver Born: March 16, 1892 Died: June 16 1967.

These four items may or may not be in use and require more research by the parish historian

The Bell Instrument - In Thanksgiving for the Ministry of Wallace Edmond Conkling, Bishop of Chicago

The Carillon Bells – Given by Lilian K Bohlen in honor of her cousin, Henry Doring and in loving memory of cousin Paul Philip Doring 1890 – 1974


The Organ in memory of Wells Hively Sr. Musician 1903-1969

The Stations of the Cross by Clair B. Taibl in memory of her grandmother Maude Fancher Grot 1878-1954
