Peering into the Past – Jan 2018

In January 1964, the weekly paper, “The Jensen Beach Mirror” published this news on our church:

“Confirmation Service Held at All Saints – Confirmation services were conducted at All Saints Episcopal Church, Jensen Beach, Sunday afternoon at 4:00 by the Rt. Rev. Henry I. Louttit, D.D. bishop of the Diocese of South Florida, who also delivered the confirmation sermon.

Adult members of the confirmation class were: Homer J. Archambeault, Jr., Ronald Cumpsty*, George Staples, **Richard Welker***, **and Sharon** Welker. Children confirmed were **Curtis Martin Coulter**, Terry Mark Hostetter, and Arnold Davey St. Clair. In addition, three adults were received from the Roman Communion. They were Mrs. **Catherine Cumpsty**, Mrs. Lillian Staples and Mrs. Irene J. Stewart*.

Joe Svec, Wally Hostetter and Trevor Addy served as acolytes, and the organ prelude and the accompaniment for the sermon and processional hymns were played by Miss Mary Ann Winn. This is the second class to receive the rites of confirmation during the rectorate of Fr. Norman B. Feaster.

Following the services, an informal reception was held in the parish hall at which the women of the church served refreshments and members of the parish were afforded the opportunity to meet and talk with Bishop Louttit and welcome members of the confirmation class. ...”

As one might imagine, since this article was published, many of the folks mentioned are now deceased, but not all.

Richard Welker was a U.S. Air Force veteran and the manager of the Jensen Beach Winn Dixie when it was still quite new. His **widow, Sharon** was among the first to work on a website for All Saints’. **His son Rick** was confirmed here, served as an acolyte here and today his family attends the 8 o’clock service.

Curtis Martin Coulter had a career with Publix, starting as a bag boy in the Stuart Publix and completing his career as the opening manager of the Jensen Beach store by Ocean Breeze Park. Currently, he lives on Skyline Dr. in Jensen Beach.

Of the three ladies received from the Roman Catholic Church, Lillian (Mrs. George) Staples and Irene (Mrs. J. Ray) Stewart have died. **Catherine Cumpsty** was 93 when she died in Oct 2017 having lived in Ocean Breeze Park since the 1950s. Deacon Alan brought communion to Catherine for some time. **Her daughter Rhonda** would bring her mother to church when visiting. Rhonda is a 1975 graduate of Martin County High, was confirmed at All Saints’, was active in the Parish Youth Group and was married here. Today, she attends an Episcopal Church in Dublin, GA.

Choir Loft & Organ Restoration - 2017

The choir loft was sagging and the “why” had to be discovered.

On November 8th, 2017 at 11:00AM, Father Frisby signed the Vestry approved proposals from Mather's Engineering and Rizzotto General Contractor, LLC. These documents served as a notice for both firms to begin work to determine the cause and what repair work was needed. Funds raised by the Capital Fund Campaign, chaired by Steve Hatch, paid for the correction of this life/safety issue and the restoration of the organ. Simply said, this effort could not have been accomplished without their financial support.

So, what all happened? The carpet and flooring in the choir loft and church was torn up. The loft's support structure was reviewed by the engineers. The choir loft and the area under the choir loft was declared unsafe for members to use and all furnishing of the loft were removed. The issues were discovered and were repaired. When the organ was returned to the choir loft, the organ was restored.

Bill Mathers made this project a priority for his engineering firm. His on-site presence and innovative design solutions allowed us to receive successful county inspections in record time. John Rizzotto also made this project the number one priority for his construction firm. He personally was on site each day to make sure things were done as expeditiously as possible. The choir loft deconstruction and reconstruction had to work around our weekly services.

Harry Kapple, Jr. Warden, and vestryman George Bonney moved the electronic piano and the D. C. Moore Moving Company moved the organ. Betsy Stemler-Mixon, organist & choir director, and the All Saints' Choir, were flexible and found new ways to share their music ministry. Members and guests worshipped closer to the front and one another. Many were moved out of “their pew” and all sat in the original portion of the church's seating.

Steve Hatch coordinated the move and tune up the organ as well as the repair of the Houg Hall speakers. Steve studied the wiring of church bells and he insured the bells are ringing on time and the hymns are chiming at their appointed hours.

Ted Moore of the Dunne Music Company restored our Allen organ and he is the same man who installed this instrument for All Saints' in 1995.

Diane Dougello, Ritchie Menard, and vestry member, Barbara Taylor, came to help return chairs to the choir loft. Altar Guild members facilitated the temporary location of all things needed for the conduct of our worship.

Joyce Fletcher Menard provided historic insights on the previous church configurations, previous renovations and usage of the church furnishings during the project.

Adding the needed support pillar required pews to be rearranged. In addition to selecting the new flooring in the choir loft, Father Frisby approved the seating changes. An added benefit of this pew shuffle is that it improved our space for people with scooters, wheelchairs or walkers.

Paul Neff oversaw the entire undertaking, spending many days at the church. He documented the entire project and kept the vestry and key leaders informed. Treasurer Bill Smith wrote the checks to pay the bills.

The choir loft is now safe. The fine voice of the organ has been restored, just in time for the Fourth Sunday of Advent and the Christmass services of 2017!

The Rector, Wardens and Vestry are grateful to Almighty God and to ALL those who have contributed their time, talent and treasure to this endeavor.

Houg Hall Kitchen Responsibilities

“Put It Back Where You Got it & Leave Things Like you Found Them”

(i.e. Supplies, Storage and Cleanup)

Event Representative – Person coordinating an event; the one who delegates all event responsibilities and kitchen jobs for a successful event.* Members will need to be assigned the following responsibilities regarding supplies, storage and cleanup for the event:

Consumable Supplies: If your church group has a budget/raises funds, you must supply your own consumables for the event – i.e. plates, napkins, cups, coffee, cream and any additional supplies specific to your event.

Set Up: Arrange tables, chairs, hardware and any other specific needs for your event. When event is over, return everything as originally found and/or return to storage area.

Clean Up:

Equipment and Non consumables: Wash, dry and return to correct storage location. Kitchen cabinets are labeled; “eyeball” the kitchen storage area for proper placement.

Unused Consumables: Please donate any unused consumables and place in the appropriate/correct bin in the storage area.

Food: Send left overs home and/or trash small amounts of food.

Stove: If used, clean and scour the NEW stove top, oven and grill as needed.

Sink & Floor: Wash the sink and mop any spills on the floor. Mop, broom, dust pan are located in the air handler storage closet.

Trash: Consolidate trash and bring to dumpster; use new liners for each trash can.

Coffee Pot: Rinse carafes, discard coffee grounds and make certain wall switch is “OFF.”

Security: All doors to Houg Hall are to be locked.

Air Conditioners:

Kitchen – turn OFF

Air Handler Closet Unit – Turn OFF by pushing the RUN button to reset.

White Horizontal Ceiling Unit – Turn to OFF
